Flower Show Report

It was quite remarkable that there was a Flower Show at all this year, what with the horrendous rain and winds we have experienced all Summer. Some vegetables were helped by all that water but most flowers took a real battering. Indeed, even on the Saturday night some were deemed suitable for showing, whereas by the morning of the Show they were ruined. However, Gargunnock growers are obviously made of sterner stuff than that, as the Show went ahead with a fantastic display of plants, flowers, vegetables and baking.

The new staging was on display for the first time and there were many complimentary comments. This was possible by the generous award from the Community Wind Farm (funded by Navara, the operator of the Windfarm).

The Show was well supported by the School, with a number of awards won by the pupils. The most points in the children's section was won by Amber Dunn, and runner-up was Annabelle Webber, and the best exhibit for her Creature made from any vegetable was by Zoe Hart.

A new category this year in baking was the Shetland Huffsie Loaf and this proved very popular with the school and it's new oven!!

It was also pleasing that the students at Green Routes had their hard work rewarded with prizes in the fruit, veg and flowers sections and that the organisation provided a stall for plant sales.

Most points for fruit, vegetables, flowers/plants was Bill Nicol and runner-up Anne Christie. Most points for baking, preserves, knitting and fancy work was Helen Graham and runner-up Anne Christie.

New exhibitors are always particularly welcome and Lucy McAllister, who has very recently moved in to the village won first prizes for Plant in flower and Mixed Herbaceous.

Thanks are again due to everyone who contributed towards a very successful event - committee and helpers, donations for the tombola, and the generous donors on entry. A particular thanks to all who attended on such a horrendous day - you all deserve a medal.

Gargunnock Church

After six years of vacancy (yes, Rev Andy Campbell retired on 30th June 2018), we now have a Parish Minister shared within the charge of Gargunnock linked with Kippen and Norrieston Churches linked with Port of Menteith. That is four parishes under the guidance of ONE Minister with the assistance of an Ordained Local Minister (OLM).

It was on Thursday 20th June that a Service of Linkage took



place in Kippen Parish Church, arranged by Perth Presbytery as part of their Presbytery Plan for the Carse of Stirling. During the Service the congregations of Kippen and Norrieston united, after a linkage of many years, to become Kippen and Norrieston Churches; also Rev. Ellen Larson Davidson and Rev. Iain Armstrong OLM were introduced as the Ministry Team for this new charge. We must be mindful of the extremely heavy workload for the Team and offer our help and talents to ease their burden.

Going forward, Rev. Ellen and Rev Iain will each conduct Sunday Services twice a month in each of the churches. For Gargunnock this means a change to the starting time initially to 11.15am but this will be reviewed. There will be Joint Services throughout the Christian Calendar which will give us the opportunity to get to know the folks in our new neighbouring churches. **As ever ALL are WELCOME**.

The Rest Garden Update

For newbies to the village, who may not know, the Rest Garden is the area next to the cemetery. There are 4 plots in the garden and for years, Stirling Council have planted and maintained them. This year, however, the Council has let the village know that there is now no budget to keep this arrangement going. The alternative was either do nothing in which case the plots would be seeded over with grass and then be cut along with the existing grass, OR the village could take over the plot maintenance. It's good that the latter option has been accepted. Barbara Linklater, who has done a great job in planting and looking after her bee friendly plot is continuing to keep this going. Two plots have been taken over by the charity Green Routes ,(who are restoring the walled garden at Gargunnock House) and will plant out one in flowers and the other with herbs. The fourth one has been taken by Gargunnock Flower Show Committee. This plot has already been dug over, cleaned and planted with bedding plants. Old Leckie

For anyone trying to grow things this summer it's been a challenging year. It warmed up and then got cold again. Rained, then rained again. Sometimes it only rained a little bit. But still too much and too often to give a choice of reliable weather windows for hay making. When it came down to it there really was only one 4 day continuously dry spell the whole of the summer. Luckily we got our hay made then – and the shed is now satisfyingly full of both round and square bales. We were less lucky with our salad leaves. Early sowings were disappointing, and what we did get into the tunnel struggled with quality due to flea beetles and sporadic growth spurts. Our tatties have faired better – the yields are low but at least we have managed to get some out for sale, unlike the leaves.

It wasn't only the growing side that was difficult. Just as we hit peak egg sales our production dropped – numbers went down, sizing went down, shells got whiter and thinner and the yolks lighter. With the help of our poultry vet the final diagnosis was that our Leckie Layers had picked up some bronchitis – most likely from the wild bird population. Am pleased to report they have all responded well to treatment and the normal order (and quality) has been restored but it made for a bit of a stressful period.

It wasn't all bad though!

The Before and After School Clubs currently run Monday to Thursday 8-9am and 3.15 to 5.15. Please note timings may be expanded slightly depending on staffing.


We are delighted to expand our provision to include a Friday morning and we will gauge interest in the afternoon.
