After the church service, the congregation took a very wet walk down to the Square to be joined by others for another very short service. Anne Christie, Secretary of the Flower Show Committee laid a wreath on behalf of the community.

Our guest preacher, Rev Scott Brown, and the Kirk Session thank all who attended the Remembrance Day Service, when we remembered those who paid the ultimate sacrifice in service to the nation. This year Rev Brown and five members of the Flower Show Committee participated in the service.

The Roll of Honour of those from the Parish of Gargunnock who fell for their Country in the Great War 1914 – 1918 and in the Second World War 1939 – 1945 was read and a Poppy Wreath laid at the Village War Memorial, within the church. A second wreath was laid by the Community Council. Following the main Service a short Act of Remembrance took place at the Square when another wreath was laid by the Flower Show Committee, on behalf of the Residents of the village, at the Gate into the Fountain Area. Andrew Dallas played the Pipe tune 'Flowers of the Forest'.
